Getting to the Festival:

- **Ride the MDOT MTA**
 - Ride the Maryland Department of Transportation Maryland Transit Administration (MDOT MTA) to Book Festival! Public transportation is the best way to get to the festival. All MDOT MTA services are accessible for individuals with disabilities. - **The Charm City Circulator (CCC)**

- The CCC is a Fast, Friendly and Free, fully accessible public transportation service that travels four routes in Baltimore City.
 - Orange Route runs along Pratt and Lombard Streets between Hollins Market and Harbor East.
 - Purple Route runs from 33rd Street to Federal Hill.
 - Green Route runs between City Hall, Fell's Point and Johns Hopkins Hospital.
 - Banner Route runs between Fort McHenry and the Inner Harbor.

- **Driving and Parking**

- The lot in front of the **Baltimore Visitor Center** (on Light Street; enter through Lee Street) has very limited handicap parking. The eight spaces are available on a first come first served basis after 4pm.
 - The Baltimore Visitor Center/ Light Street bus lane can also be used as a drop-off/pick-up location.
 - **Hyatt Garage** – 300 Light Street – 24 ADA spaces
 - **Light Street Garage** – 30 Light Street – 30 ADA spaces
 - **Lockwood Garage** – 124 Market Place – 24 ADA spaces
 - **Marina Garage** (Rusty Scupper) – 402 Key Highway – 5 ADA spaces
 - **The Gallery at Harborplace** – 101 South Calvert Street – 20 ADA spaces
 - **Water Street Garage** – 414 Water Street – 22 ADA spaces

- Bike parking is available on the lawn behind the Baltimore Visitors Center.

At the Festival:

- The Access Center is located at the top of the Inner Harbor Amphitheater
- At the Access Center, staff and volunteers can assist festival-goers with accessibility needs and answer questions.
- Wheelchair accessible temporary restrooms are available near:
 - Bicentennial Plaza (Light St. and Conway St.) – near Visitor Center
 - West Shore Park (near Light St. and Lee St.) – behind Spirit Cruises
 - Rash Field (parallel to Inner Harbor)
- Bike medics will be roaming throughout the event site to assist with issues. All emergency situations should be directed to 911.
- Service animals are allowed at the festival, under the control and alongside of its handler at all times. Disruptive or dangerous animals will be asked to leave the site.
- The festival does not provide wheelchair rental or an area to store/refrigerate medications.
